DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,



FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT:

As we begin the Holy Season of Advent, let us remember that it is a season for renewed hope and trust in God. The Church provides us with Advent so that we can spiritually prepare ourselves to celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In these challenging times, in our Church, world and society, we need to rely more than ever on our faith, hope and trust in God and the presence of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Let us never forget the real reason for the season... to make room in our hearts and our lives every day for the presence of Jesus. The Catechism of the Catholic Church stresses the two-fold meaning of Advent: "When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for His second coming." 
To make the most of Advent, consider some of the following practices:

- Take 10-15 minutes each day for personal prayer and reflection.
- Participate in livestream daily Mass at 12:10 p.m. or come in person if you are able.
- Avail yourself of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Always remember that Confession is a Sacrament of Healing and not a Sacrament of judgment. It is a beautiful opportunity to cleanse the soul and heal our troubled consciences. God's love and mercy are unconditional.

WHAT IS THE RITE OF ACCEPTANCE & WELCOMING?

The Rite of Acceptance is an ancient Rite of the Church that recognizes the decision of the Catechumens (unbaptized) to begin the process of becoming a member of the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation & Eucharist, and welcomes the Candidates (those who have been baptized in another faith tradition or baptized Catholic as a child, but never catechized in the Catholic faith) into full communion with the Catholic Church.

In the Rite of Acceptance, a change of identity takes place: those previously known as inquirers become catechumens and candidates.


Assembling publicly for the first time, the candidates, who have completed the initial period of inquiry, declare their intention to the Church and the Church in turn, carrying out its apostolic mission, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members. The text calls this rite "the first consecration by the Church" of those seeking Christian initiation.

They are literally marked with the cross of Christ on their foreheads.

This beautiful rite will take place next Sunday, December 7th, at the 12:00 Noon Mass. At this Mass, we will begin to pray for our brothers and sisters who are anticipating to fully enter into the Church here at Our Lady of Victory Basilica Parish. Please pray for these candidates and join us in welcoming them here at Our Lady of Victory.
