Sacrament of Baptism:

Our Parish offers a special Pre-Baptism preparation program for parents who desire to share their faith with their children. Parents-to-be must attend this class prior to the birth of their child. Baptisms are usually scheduled two times each month. Call the Rectory to register for classes. Godparents must be Confirmed and practicing Catholics. Non-parishioners are required to have a Letter of Recommendation to serve as a sponsor.

Sacrament of Marriage:

To be married in the Basilica, you must be an active parishioner for at least 9 months prior to setting a date. Engaged couples should contact the pastor before making other wedding arrangements. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana Conference, or equivalent pre-marriage preparation program.

Letters of Recommendation:

Recommendations to act as sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation can be issued only to registered members of Our Lady of Victory Parish who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, attend Mass and receive Holy Communion regularly, have their children attending a Catholic school or Religious Education class. If married, the marriage must be in conformity with the regulations of the Catholic Church.

Devotions:

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament begins immediately after the 12:10 p.m. Mass in the Basilica on Fridays and concludes with Benediction at 5:00 p.m.

First Friday:

On the eve of the First Friday of each month there are confessions from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. Mass is celebrated at 7:30 p.m. on First Friday.

Care of the Sick:

Please notify the rectory office for a visit to any family member who is sick, in the hospital or confined to home. Regular home Communion visits are usually on the First Friday of the month by a priest, deacon, or minister of the Eucharist.

A Message from Father Paul

This weekend, March 30-31, we welcome a Catholic Charities representative, who will be speaking at all of our Masses. As you know, we are in the middle of this year's Catholic Charities Campaign. The goal is \$11 million. Our diocese has the honor of being one of the most charitable dioceses in the country when it comes to our Catholic Charities Appeal. Each year, the Appeal holds its most significant push during Lent, ending on Palm Sunday. However, the Appeal continues through the month of June. You can return your pledge or donation by mailing it directly to Catholic Charities, or by mailing it to the rectory, or by putting it in the weekend collection. If you have not received an Appeal donation card, please call the rectory and we will make sure you get one. I am grateful to Maureen and Brendan Gannon, who have once again this year, offered to serve as our parish chairpersons for this important effort.

On Saturday this weekend, we welcome a tour group from St. Luke's Mission of Mercy in Buffalo. This group is spending Saturday as "Father Baker Day" - visiting sites in Western New York which have a particular significance in Father Baker's life. After visiting other Western New York sites on Saturday morning, they will be spending Saturday afternoon here at the Basilica, and then doing a bus tour of parts of our property which continue Father Baker's legacy through Baker Victory Services and the Homes of Charity. We welcome them warmly to our parish this Saturday.

Once again, please note the up-coming Holy Week dates and times. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, April 14. We begin Holy Week by following Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Palms will be blessed and distributed at all of the Masses that weekend.

Beginning on Thursday of Holy Week, we enter into the holiest days of our church year. It is called Holy Week, or the Sacred Triduum (Sacred Three Days).

Each morning during Holy Week, ***at 9:00 a.m., we will pray Morning Prayer in the Basilica.*** This ten-to-fifteen minute prayer is a good way to begin these holy days. All are welcome.

On Holy Thursday, we commemorate the evening of the Lord's Supper at our 7:00 p.m. Mass. This is the only Mass allowed on this day. Following Mass, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose, where people are invited to come and pray until 10:00 p.m.

On Good Friday, the Liturgy of the Cross, will be celebrated at 3:00 p.m. This is the only day of the year on which Mass is not celebrated. This ancient Liturgy of the Cross replaces the Mass. Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Good Friday at Noon in the Upper Basilica, and the "living Stations of the Cross" will be celebrated in Holy Cross cemetery. Stations will also be prayed at 7:00 p.m. on Good Friday evening.

On Holy Saturday, March 20, the Great Easter Vigil will begin at 8:00 p.m. (Please note that there will be no 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass since the Easter Vigil is the only liturgy allowed on this day). The Vigil includes the lighting of the Easter Fire, the reading of the great Old Testament passages of salvation, the Baptism and Confirmation of new members, and the renewal of Baptismal Vows for all of us.

Please consider making these ceremonies part of your celebration of Holy Week and Easter this year. These are the high holy days of our church.

May Jesus, our Savior, bless you and Our Lady of Victory watch over you.
